Dear Northern Grampians Shire (NGS) organisations and health services (or organisations with NGS staff),

Please see below the latest news on where to get the COVID-19 vaccine in Northern Grampians Shire (NGS). This email also lists vaccine eligibility criteria, testing locations and other useful resources. Health Services and Local Government in Northern Grampians shire are working together to inform you about local access to vaccination as part of the National vaccination roll out.

# All information correct as of 16th August 2021

### Current COVID-19 vaccine eligibility

**People aged 60 and over will receive an AstraZeneca vaccine** (exception: reserved Pfizer vaccine appointments groups <u>view list here</u>)

**59 and under will receive a Pfizer vaccine** (exception: people not yet eligible to get Pfizer who choose to get AstraZeneca, see below)

The following groups are currently eligible for a COVID-19 vaccine (alternatively quickly check eligibility online here):

- Everyone aged 40 and above
- People aged 16 39 who are in priority groups (read more on each group here), which includes:
  - Hotel guarantine and border workers and their household contacts
  - Healthcare workers
  - People who are pregnant (read more)
  - Aged care staff and residents
  - Disability care staff and residents
  - Critical and high risk workers who are currently employed
    - Includes defence force personnel, police, fire, emergency services workers, meat and seafood processing workers, corrective and detention services including community correction staff, staff working in high risk accommodation settings such as supported residential services, public transport drivers and public transport workers who are public facing, ride share and taxi drivers, all staff at international ports of entry
  - Adults with a significant disability or who are participants of NDIS
  - People with a disability who are participants of NDIS
  - People with an underlying medical condition
  - People who are vulnerable and at high risk of contracting or developing serious illness from COVID-19
    - Includes those experiencing homelessness, sleeping rough, or in emergency
      accommodation, those receiving drug and alcohol support services, residents of residential
      mental health facilities, those in sensitive accommodation including high rise/low rise public
      housing, supported residential services, community housing, rooming houses and others,
      prisoners in custody and detainees within corrections facilities
  - Carers (paid and unpaid) of some individuals eligible under Phase 1a and 1b, or of children with specified medical conditions
  - Some disability and aged care support volunteers
  - Travellers who have received a travel restriction exemption from the Australian Government to

leave Australia

- People who have already had their first dose of a COVID-19 vaccine
- Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander people (<u>read more</u>)
- Aged over 18 and are happy to get the AstraZeneca jab instead of the Pfizer (can get from specific state run vaccination centres (closest in Ballarat) or participating GPs. Read more)
- Children aged 12 15 in priority groups, which includes:
  - Children who have specified medical conditions that increase their risk of severe COVID-19 (read more)
  - Children who are Aboriginal and / or Torres Strait Islander

Note: you can have a free vaccine even without a Medicare card (read more if you don't have a Medicare card)

# Current NGS COVID-19 vaccination availability

- Stawell Regional Health has both AstraZeneca and Pfizer available. Book your COVID-19 vaccination by getting, completing and dropping off your consent form at several locations in Stawell (instructions and locations here). SRH staff will call you to book an appointment when it's your turn.
- Patrick St Family Clinic (Stawell) now has both Pfizer and AstraZeneca in stock. Call to book in a vaccine appointment, new clients welcome.
- East Wimmera Health Service (EWHS) encourages the community to check the EWHS Facebook page and website for the latest on their COVID-19 vaccination schedule. EWHS is running the following pop up clinics:
  - St Arnaud: 9<sup>th</sup> September (AstraZeneca and Pfizer)
  - Charlton: 19<sup>th</sup> August, 26<sup>th</sup> August, 2<sup>nd</sup> September, 16<sup>th</sup> September (Pfizer and AstraZeneca)
- St Arnaud Medical Clinic has AstraZeneca in stock (no pfizer). The Clinic welcomes new clients for COVID-19 vaccines.
