<b>Detailing your project (40%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The project description clearly states the purpose of the project.</li> <li>● The aims and benefits are clear and show a strong link between activities and outcomes.</li> <li>● The benefits are clearly demonstrated in the project aims.</li> <li>● There is a clear link between the funding stream and the project.</li> <li>● The application demonstrates strong community benefit in the project aims.</li> <li>● The application demonstrates evidence of project partners.</li> </ul>
<b>Demonstrates good project planning</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● The application clearly articulates all tasks in a logical order and how the project will be completed.</li> <li>● There is excellent project planning demonstrated with an accurate timeline. Aims and outcomes are linked to delivering the tasks.</li> <li>● There is evidence of a high level of collaboration in planning the project.</li> <li>● The plan demonstrates the project can survive beyond the funding if applicable.</li> </ul>
<b>Realistic project budget (25%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● There is a comprehensive budget submitted that has evidence of costs and where income matches expenditure.</li> <li>● The application shows some funds/in kind contribution.</li> </ul>
<b>Consideration for project risks (10%)</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>● If permits are required, there is some positive evidence that the application will be granted via pre-application documentation.</li> <li>● Risks have been identified and management of those risks documented.</li> </ul>
