# Prescribed Accommodation

The *Public Health and Wellbeing Act 2008* provides the legal framework for the registration process while the *Public Health and Wellbeing (Prescribed Accommodation) Regulations 2020* provide the legislative requirements for the establishment and registration of prescribed accommodation premises.

### Registration

If you intend to operate any of the following types of accommodation business, you are required to register as a Prescribed Accommodation premises under the *Public Health and Wellbeing Act and Regulations*. The list is not exhaustive and should contact the council's Environmental Health Services for further information.

- Residential accommodation
- Hotels and Motels
- Hostels
- Student dormitories
- Holiday camps
- Rooming houses
- Any type of dwelling where:
  - o Excluding the family of the occupier, six or more guests can be accommodated, and
  - The property can be occupied by more than one occupying group. (This includes B&Bs and guesthouses which can accommodate six or more guests.)

You do not require this registration if you operate any of the following:

- Caravan Park
- House and granny flat
- Public hospital or nursing home
- Retirement village
- Temporary crisis accommodation

# **Ongoing Requirements**

Once your premises is registered it will:

- Be inspected annually to ensure the accommodation complies with the *Public Health and Wellbeing* (*Prescribed Accommodation*) *Regulations 2020*.
- Renewed annually on 1 January each year.
- Any business that has not had a satisfactory inspection may be refused registration the following year.
- Registration may be transferred to another person or premises.
- If you plan to sell food at your accommodation business, you may also require registration under the *Food Act 1984*. Please visit the Food Premises page for more information.

## Information for rooming house residents

- Check that a Rooming house is registered before you sign an agreement

## Information for building owners

Buildings and residences are given classes according to their use. In order for a building owner to change a single-family residence (Class 1a) to a share house (Class 1b) where four or more unrelated people may be residing, the involvement of Council is required.
