# WHAT TO RECYCLE

THE FOLLOWING ITEMS **CAN** BE PLACED IN YOUR RECYCLING BIN (YELLOW LID)



Cardboard (Flattened) & All Paper  
(Including Envelopes & Junkmail)



Milk & Juice Cartons



Glass Bottles & Jars

### RECYCLING TIPS

- Flatten bulky items
- Empty bottles and containers



Aluminium Cans,  
Trays & Foils



Steel Cans & Aerosols



Magazines, Newspapers  
& Phone Books



Rigid Plastic Containers,  
Bottles & Trays

### NOT IN THIS BIN



- **NO** Plastic Bags
- **NO** Syringes
- **NO** Nappies
- **NO** Food Waste
- **NO** Garden Waste
- **NO** polystyrene (including meat trays)
- **NO** Glassware or Window Glass
- **NO** Clothing or Shoes
- **NO** Crockery or Ceramics
- **NO** Light Globes
- **NO** Electronics
- **NO** Batteries

### BIN PLACEMENT TIPS

1. Timing - Place your bins out the night before your scheduled collection day.

- Waste is collected weekly and recycling is collected fortnightly
- Refer to calendar overleaf for the weeks recycling is collected

2. Place bin close to the kerb, with the wheels facing your property.

3. Keep bins away from obstructions.

- Place bins at least 0.50 metre away from obstructions such as other bins, posts, power poles, and trees

4. Don't overfill. Ensure the lid is closed when placed out for collection and all items are contained within the bin. Council's contractor will not empty bins that are overfull or have bagged waste on the ground.

5. Don't jam the bin. Material placed inside the bin must be able to be moved freely.

- Material that is jammed in the bin will not come out when the bin is being emptied
